Purpose

Seenaryo's Code of Ethics describes how the organisation shall carry out its work and, by extension, how its staff (whether employees, freelancers or volunteers) shall conduct themselves when working for Seenaryo.

Code of Ethics

We will strive to involve and train our beneficiaries in the management and delivery of our activities.

We will actively promote theatre and play-based education (and the combination of these two) in the environments in which we work.

We will work actively to protect our beneficiaries (in particular, young people, children and women) by abiding by our safeguarding policy.

In both our delivery and communications, we shall recognise our beneficiaries as artists, creators, teachers and so on - not simply refugees or vulnerable communities.

We will show respect for all persons equally, without distinction of race, gender, religion, sexual orientation, political persuasion, disability or age.

We shall respect the cultures, customs and traditions of those with whom we work.

We will aim to build meaningful working relations with our partner organizations – both those with whom we work in the field, and those who support us from afar.

We will hold ourselves accountable to those with whom we work and those from whom we accept resources.
